PU readers can:

- Acquire and use accurately grade-appropriate general academic and domain specific words and phrases.
- Cite textual evidence to support analysis of what the text says explicitly as well as inferences drawn from the text.
- By the end of the year, read and comprehend literature, including stories, dramas, and poems, and literary nonfliction.

While working in this level, PU readers learn to:

- Determine a theme or central idea of a text and how it is conveyed through particular details
- Describe how a particular story's or drama's plot unfolds in a series of episodes as well as how the characters respond or change as the plot moves towards a resolution.
- Analyze in detail how a key individual, event, or idea is introduced, illustrated, and elaborated upon in a text.
- Determine the meaning of words and phrases as they are used in a text.
- Analyze the impact of a specific word choice on meaning and tone.
- Analyze how a particular sentence, chapter, scene, or stanza fits into the overall structure of a text.
- Explain how an author develops the point of view of the narrator or speaker in a text.
- Compare and contrast the experience of reading a story, drama, or poem to listening or viewing an audio, video, or live version of the text.
- Integrate information presented in different media or formats as well as in words to develop a coherent understanding of a topic or issue.
- Trace and evaluate the argument and specific claims in a text.
- · Compare and contrast texts in different forms or genres
- Compare and contrast one author's presentation of events with that of another.
- Use common Greek or Latin affixes and roots as clues to the meaning of a word.
- Interpret figures of speech in context.
- Use combined knowledge of all letter-sound correspondences, syllabication patterns, and morphology to accurately read unfamiliar multisyllabic words.
- Consult reference materials (dictionaries, glossaries, thesauruses)
- Read a variety of genres (Biography, adventure, historical fiction, drama, poetry)
