> Encourage your child to read at least 30 minutes a day and to finish a chapter book per week.

### To access digital text for your child to read at home:

- Log in to your child's myPascoConnect account. There your child will have access to text through Bookshelf, Discovery Education, and other digital resources.
- Visit your local Pasco County Library to sign your child up for their own library card or access the **Tumble Book Library** by visiting the New Port Richey Library Website and clicking on the Tumble Books link. http://nprlibrary.org/



#### Talk to your child about what they are reading.

- · Discuss words that may be unfamiliar to your child.
- Help your child to use context clues to figure out the unfamiliar words.

Encourage your child to read different types of literature and informational text.

Here are some sample questions you can ask your child when they are reading.

#### Literature/Fiction

Fables, fairy tales, folk tales, legends, myths, poetry, verse, mystery, science fiction, historical fiction, etc.

- · What lesson did you learn from the story?
- What challenges does the main character face and how do they overcome those challenges?
- How do the illustrations contribute to your understanding of the text?
- · What are some of the key events in the story?

#### Informational/ Non fiction

Magazines, newspapers, non-fiction books, research, speeches, infographic, biography, etc.

- · What are you learning from the text?
- · What have you learned from the text features in the text?
- What are the most important points and details presented in each text?
- What are you still wondering that you want to learn more about?



Section 1008.25(5), Florida Statutes (F.S.), to be promoted to fourth grade, a third-grade student must score a Level 2 or above on the statewide Florida Standards Assessment – English Language Arts (FSA-ELA). Also, a parent of a student in grade 3, who is identified anytime during the year as being at-risk of retention, may request that the school immediately begin collecting portfolio evidence.
